Business Plan 2024-2026

Kingston and Richmond Safeguarding Children Partnership



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Introduction

KRSCP arrangements are led by the statutory safeguarding Partners: Local authority, Police, and Integrated Care Board, alongside relevant partners from statutory organisations, schools and the voluntary sector to work in close collaboration to safeguard and promote the welfare of all children and young people in Kingston and Richmond.

They, through the executive group, coordinate safeguarding activities, act as a strategic leadership group in supporting and engaging others, and implement local and national learning, including from serious child safeguarding incidents (Working Together 2023).

This business plan sets out the strategic priorities that the partnership has identified and will be the primary focus across 2024 to 2026. The plan will support the involvement of services with children and young people in the local area, with the aspiration of supporting each child to reach their full potential.

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Our Vision and Values

Our vision is that children and young people in Kingston & Richmond live a life free from fear, harm, abuse and exploitation, enabling every child to achieve their potential. Our vision is underpinned by our core value of working together to keep children's safety and wellbeing at the heart of everything we do.

We aim to do this by:

1) Supporting Children

Robust and timely identification of need to support children and their families/carers across the multi-agency partnership.

2) Protecting Children

Children are protected through effective multi agency arrangements which are child centred.

3) Understanding the Child's World

Value all aspects of children's identity and understand the links to vulnerability from all harm including discrimination and harassment.

Priority 1: Child Sexual Abuse and Exploitation
