
1. This Serious Case Review regarding safeguarding children at St Paul's School was published on 13<sup>th</sup> January 2020. This is a holistic statutory review of the conduct of agencies involved in allegations of abuse. The majority of recommendations are aimed at firmly establishing a culture where the safety and wellbeing of pupils is paramount and in helping schools to put this into practice in a context where academic success may be perceived as the top priority in all schools;
