1. This is local good practice from a Police & **LADO** (Local Authority Designated Officer) investigation, when an allegation was made against school staff about online grooming of pupils.

2. **Communication** LADO referrals to the SPA work best when made within 24 hours of receipt of concern. Ensure all parties communicate regularly & plan together when to inform suspect, family, children former pupils & staff. Prepare for media interest.

3. **Welfare** of children & staff is paramount. Plan support & regular updates for all affected, including suspect. Offers of counselling can help.

4. **Evidence** Plan any arrests before staff suspension so devices can't be wiped

6 **Knowledge** is power. Ensure children, families & staff are regularly reminded about how to report concerns however small, and how to stay safe online. See the NSPCC Virtual Campaign Speak out Stay Safe: <u>https://learning.nspcc.org.uk/services/speak-out-stay-safe</u>

5. **Safer Recruitment** of staff & volunteers should have a clear focus on safeguarding & be regularly reinforced in Appraisals & Team Meetings. Encourage a culture of self-disclosure
